

# Nettie Hat Version 2

Knitted flat, seamed and ruched

**Materials:** 140 yards of light worsted weight or heavy dk yarn  
**Needle size:** US 7 24" circular needle  
**Gauge:** 18 stitches over 4" in stockinette stitch

Abbreviations:

K: knit

P: purl

RS: Right Side

WS: Wrong Side

K2tog: knit two together

## **Directions**

Cast on 91 stitches

### **Step 1:**

Row 1 (RS): K

Row 2 (WS): P

Repeat row 1 and 2 until your piece measures 8" from CO edge.

**Step 2: Decreasing for the top**

Row 1 (RS): \*K8, k2tog. Repeat from \* to last st, k1.

Row 2 (WS): P

Row 3: \*K7, k2tog. Repeat from \* to last st, k1.

Row 4: P

Row 5: \*K6, k2tog. Repeat from \* to last st, k1.

Row 6: P

Row 7: \*K5, k2tog. Repeat from \* to last st, k1.

Row 8: P

Row 9: \*K4, k2tog. Repeat from \* to last st, k1.

Row 10: P

Row 11: \*K3, k2tog. Repeat from \* to last st, k1.

Row 12: P

Row 13: \*K2, k2tog. Repeat from \* to last st, k1.

Row 14: P

Row 15: K1, k2tog. Repeat from \* to last st, k1.

Row 16: P1, P2tog to end of row.

**Step 5:**

Cut yarn, leaving a 20" tail. Thread onto darning needle, run through the remaining sts and fasten off.

Seam the sides of hat together using the mattress stitch aka invisible seam stitch.

Once it is seamed, bunch up your hat by pushing the end up along the your seamed tail. Weave in ends.
